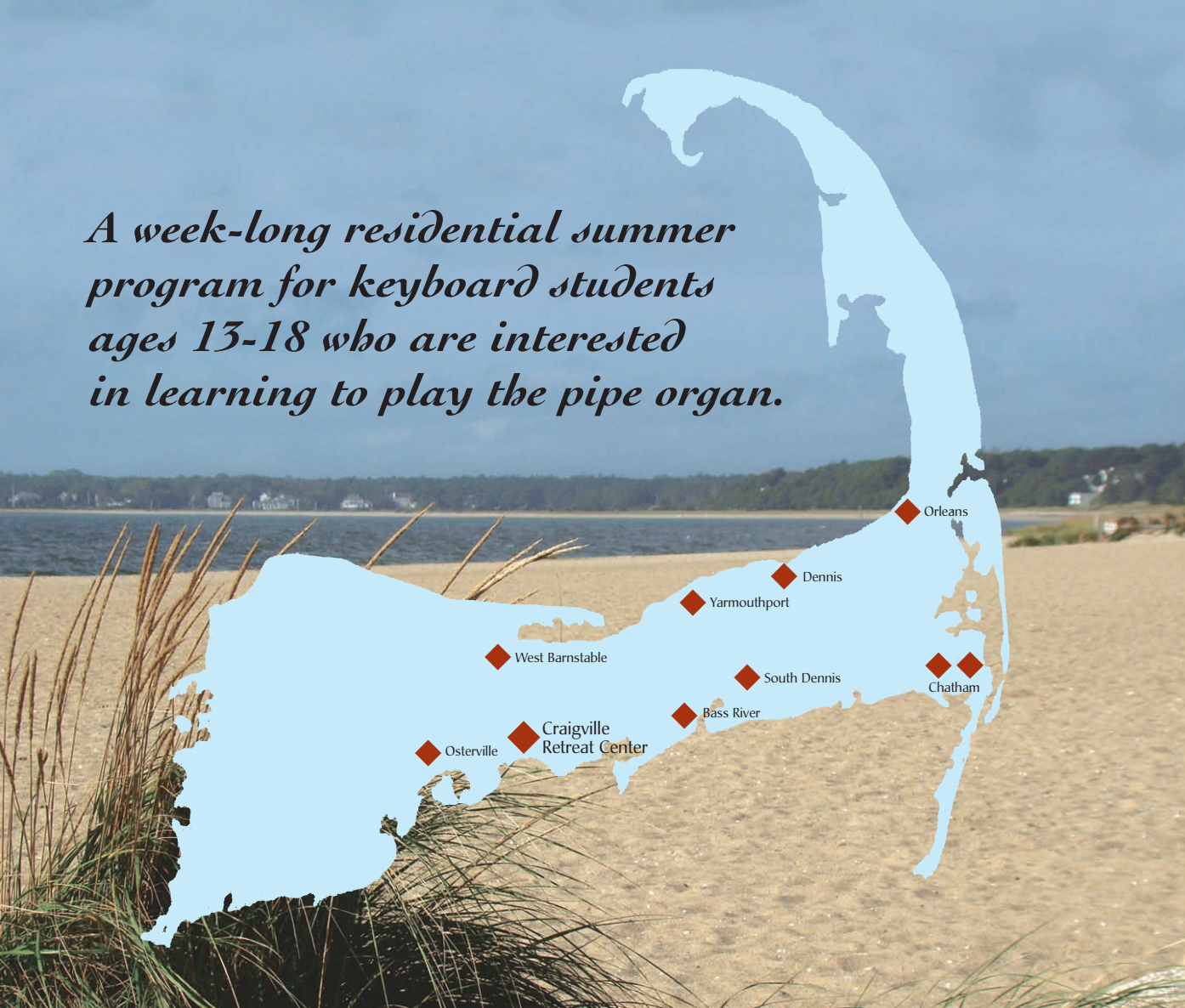


A week-long residential summer program for keyboard students ages 13-18 who are interested in learning to play the pipe organ.

Overview

Spend five summer days on Cape Cod, exploring and playing both historic and modern instruments – while studying with world-class teachers every day. There's even time in the schedule to go to the beach! Our Pipe Organ Encounter (POE) is designed for teenagers ages 13-18 who have achieved at least an intermediate level of keyboard proficiency. Previous organ study is not required. For the exceptional student, special consideration can be given with regard to age and training as allowed by the POE committee.

Instruction

Private instruction is at the heart of every POE. Each student will receive a daily hour lesson and an hour of practice time on a suitable organ or piano. Instructors include Clara Gerdes, James Jordan, Christian Lane, Amanda Mole, Julian Petrallia, Caroline Robinson, Janet Yieh, and Steven Young.

Accommodations

Students and chaperones will stay at the Craigville Retreat Center, just steps away from a private beach on Nantucket Sound. Student rooms are double occupancy, with a few quads. Breakfast and lunch (boxed) will be at Craigville; dinner will be out at various locations. Travel to Cape Cod can be made by air, bus, and limited train service from Boston. The POE committee can assist with travel questions and connections.

Application Process

The Cape Cod POE has a maximum enrollment of 18 students. The online application is available at www.agohq.org/education/poe/poe/. Applications will be forwarded to the POE registrar on Cape Cod. Applications are acknowledged by e-mail or letter. If the student meets the requirements, the full registration fee is required before the student is enrolled. Students who do not meet the requirements will be notified that they have not been accepted.
